

## How to Measure:

Here's how to measure your body for the perfect fit every time. Keep the measuring tape comfortably loose and stand as you normally would.

**Bust:** Measure around your body, under your arms and over the fullest part of your bust.

**Waist:** Measure around your natural waistline. For a relaxed fit, add 2"-4" to your waist size or measure around your abdomen where you want your pants to sit.

**Hip:** Measure around the fullest part of your hips (about 8" below your waist).

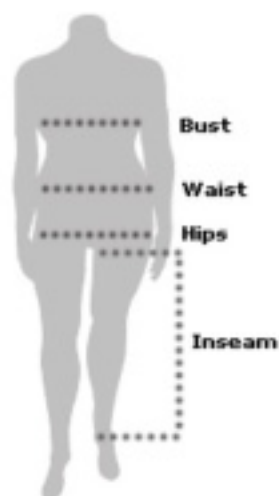
**Inseam:** Find a pair of pants that fit you well. Measure them from the crotch seam down the inside seam to the cuff.

**Dresses:** Determine whether your top half or your bottom half is larger. Use the larger measurements for your dress size. You can always alter a dress to fit the smaller half of your body, if needed.

**Belts:** Measure the top of your hips. This is approximately 2" below the waist. If you like your pants to sit lower, measure around your abdomen where you want your belt to fit.

**Bra:** Wrap measuring tape snugly (but not tightly) around your ribcage and right under your bust. If that number is odd, round up to the next even number. This is the band size. Ex: measurement is 37", round up to 38".

Now, measure around your body, under your arms and over the fullest part of your bust. Subtract your band size from this number.



Difference	Cup Size

Example: If your band size is 44 and your bust measurement is 48 then  $48-44=4=D$ . You are a 44D.

**Corset:** Your corset size is your bra band size plus one for each cup size. (See above for bra measuring instructions.) Example: if you are a 44D, you wear a size 48 corset.

**Purse Strap Drop:** This is the amount of space between the purse and the top of the bag. Find a bag with a strap length you really like and hold it from the center of the strap. Measure the space from the middle of the strap straight down to the top of the bag. This is a great way to figure out if a purse has your ideal strap length.

**Shoes:** Torrid uses a plus size fit model for shoes to ensure that our shoes fit you. To measure your calf for tall boots, find the widest part of your lower leg (usually the swell of your calf) and measure around it. To measure a boot's inside calf width, measure one side of the boot from middle front to middle back. Double this number for circumference of the inside of the boot.
